Generally, if we have already discussed some of the details of providing ceremony music as part of our services, consideration for that is most likely included in the original quote. If the quote included a range, the particular circumstances will determine a final quote. If the ceremony is in the same basic space and time as the rest of the celebration, there may be no additional setup or significant added time required. Should the ceremony be separate from other parts of the celebration and require additional time, travel, and setup for those members playing, additional compensation may be appropriate.

Musically, some pieces that are new to us are relatively straightforward. Should a new piece require a good deal of time for arranging and rehearsing, we might look at the need for additional compensation for those band members arranging, preparing, and playing the selections.

If we are discussing ceremony music as an addition to what we have previously discussed, or we have not yet discussed your specific selections, additional compensation might be appropriate and requested.

We approach all of this on a case by case basis. We are happy to discuss all of this in hopes of working out something mutually agreeable.
